Dear Team Bayview,

WELCOME BACK

We sincerely hope you managed some special time with your children over the recent school term break. The children were so very tired after our fabulous production and it was lovely to see the sun come out during the break so the kids could recover and recuperate.

We have had a lovely start to Term 4 even though the weather has been cold and miserable! I'm sure the warmer weather is on its way and the wind will settle down soon (don't quote me on it though!)

Term 4 is our term for celebration. This is the term that we celebrate the fabulous progress and achievement of our children. We have a range of events where celebrations will be held. These include a child led conference open day where you can come into school during the day and have your child share their learning with you, a sports and volunteers awards ceremony, a full school prizegiving, a parent volunteer thank you event with the Board of Trustees, and then we farewell our Year 6 students and any staff who will be leaving us at the end of this year.

We do hope you will be able to join us for some of these events. Please check the diary to the left for the dates.

DONATION SCHEME 2020

The Bayview School Board of Trustees have decided to take advantage of the Governments donation scheme for schools in 2020. Every school who opts into this scheme will receive \$150 per student to pay for curriculum based activities.

Please note this is yet to make its way through parliament to become law but if it does it will have a wide range of implications for both the school and yourselves. These include:

Stationery – we can ask you to provide stationery but we cannot demand that you buy it from the school supplier (we have never demanded this anyway). A stationery list will be supplied with the end of year report.

Uniform – Parents are still required to provide the Bayview school uniform.

School donations – parents will not be asked to pay an annual school donation. If parents would like to still donate they are free to do so, but we will not solicit this. School trips – if we send the children on a school trip which is based on the curriculum, we will not ask parents to pay a fee for this. If there is a trip which is over and above the curriculum and is voluntary, we would charge for this.

Fundraising – we are still able to run fundraising events throughout the school year i.e. multi days, daffodil day, disco's, etc.

We will keep you updated on this as the legislation goes through parliament and the Ministry of Education bring out clearer guidelines for schools.

BUILDING A NEW PLAYGROUND

Every school in New Zealand who wishes to build a new adventure playground must gain the permission of the Ministry of Education to spend funds on this. After a 3 month wait (the wheels turn very slowly in Government departments) we have finally received permission to proceed with building the new playground we have been fundraising for! Wahoo!

We have confirmed the order and if everything goes to plan this will be built for the start of the 2020 academic year!

I am very proud of the process we used to design this. We sent students off to visit playgrounds around Auckland and as a result of these visits the students recommended equipment they would like to see included in the new design. We developed a core group who worked alongside three separate playground companies and each developed a design concept. We then shared these design concepts with the children and with the community and surveyed each for their thoughts. From this we found a winning design and this is the one that is being installed in January.

A core focus at Bayview School is to empower our children to make a difference in the world. We want our children to know that they have a voice and that their opinions matter. We want them to know that through hard work and research that they can drive improvements in their school and community. Many of the things we have at Bayview have been initiated by the students e.g. bee hives, chickens, murals, etc.

YEAR 6 LEGACY

In term 4 every year our Year 6 students work on leaving a legacy that makes Bayview School better than they found it. Past legacies have included the sandpit, the eco hut, a new slide, and freshly painted bench seats. This year our Year 6 students will be working on more legacies which will leave the school better than it was when they first started six years ago. It makes me very proud to know that our children leave Bayview with a sense of pride in the school and in themselves. Thank you in advance for the parents who are able to assist the children in creating these lasting legacies.

In the past we have had many Year 6 students donate a living legacy in the form of a fruit tree. You may know that we have two orchards at Bayview School. We have a citrus orchard by the chickens and a fruit tree orchard at the back of the big green playground. These trees are now beginning to bear fruit which is used by the students in a range of ways such as on top of the weetbix at breakfast club, making fruit kebabs, and I am waiting for someone to make apple crumble... maybe this season 🍏
